



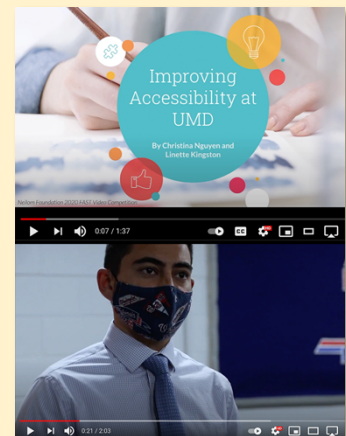
## 2021 FAST Video Competition

## Terms and Conditions:

- Eligible videos must be no more than 2 minutes long. Videos that are outside of these guidelines will not be considered for the competition.
- Students may enter individually or in teams of up to five (5). In teams, prize will be split up evenly between team members.
- Students must be currently enrolled in STEM disciplines at the University of Maryland College Park, The George Washington University, The Johns Hopkins University, Morgan State University and Catholic University.
- The submitted video must focus on the area described for this year's competition.
- Videos may not contain any copyrighted element including music, videos, or photographs. Be sure that you have obtained all necessary legal rights for the content of your video.
- All video participants must give informed consent of their participation in order to take part in the filming of your video.
- Videos may not contain vulgar language or inappropriate content. The Neilom Foundation reserves the right to determine inappropriate content and disqualify a video.
- Only one video entry may be submitted per student – a student cannot be a part of multiple teams submitting videos.
- Previous competition winners are not eligible to enter.
- Videos must be submitted by 23:59:59 EST on November 15, 2021 in order to be considered for contest participation.

## How to submit your video to the FAST competition:

- Upload your video to YouTube.
- Then submit the link to your video via email to **fast@neilom.org** by **November 15, 2021**.
- **Please include in your email a profile picture, a short bio, and a paragraph of why you felt compelled to focus on your topic.**
